FASTING REGULATIONS FOR LENT

- 1.) Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and total abstinence.
- 2.) All Fridays of Lent are days of total abstinence.
- 3.) ABSTINENCE No meat or meat products may be eaten. By "meat or meat products" red meat, from warm blooded animals is understood, including poultry. Abstinence binds everyone from age 14 until death.
- 4.) FAST- One full meal and two additional meals not equaling a second full meal may be taken. The main penance in this case is not snacking between meals. Liquids do not break the fast. Fast obliges from your 18th birthday until your 59th birthday.
- 5.) The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is grave.

To intentionally disregard this obligation is seriously or mortally sinful.

Nonetheless, the fast is never to impair the execution of one's work or other duties.

Easter Duty

Catholics are reminded of their Easter Duty, the obligation to receive the Holy Eucharist during the Easter Season. This obligation is grave.

In the USA, this time is reckoned from Ash Wednesday, (March 5, 2025) through Trinity Sunday, (June 15, 2025).

BYOP: Bring Your Own Palms

The company normally supplying palms has lost their inventory due to a flood. Please bring your own palms to be blessed next Sunday. Palms may be any branches either green or budding. Northern regions still commonly use Pussy Willows as they are normally budding by Palm Sunday: in German they're called *Palmkätchen*, "Palm-Kittens".
